

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF DESERONTO

BY-LAW NUMBER 6-97

Being a By-law to regulate traffic and parking in the Corporation of the Town of Deseronto.

The Council of the Corporation of the Town of Deseronto enacts as follows:

Part I – DEFINITIONS

1. In This By-law:

- (1) "Authorized Sign", means any sign or roadway, curb or sidewalk marking or other device placed or erected on or near a road under the authority of this by-law or the *Highway Traffic Act* for the purpose of regulating, warning, parking or guiding traffic: stop signs and include yellow paint applied to a Curb to indicate that parking is prohibited where the Curb is so marked.
- (2) "Bicycle" includes a tricycle having a wheel or wheels of more than 45 centimetres in diameter, but does not include a motor-assisted bicycle.
- (3) "Boulevard" shall mean the untravelled portion of the road allowance, including the sidewalk, which is not intended for use by vehicular traffic.
- (4) "Business Improvement Area" shall mean the entire Town of Deseronto with the exception of the lands zoned under the Zoning By-law for the Town of Deseronto for a manufacturing use.
- (5) "Commercial Business District" shall mean the area bounded by and including Mill Street to the west, Thomas Street to the north, Prince Street to the east and Main Street to the south.
- (6) "Commercial Motor Vehicle" means a vehicle having a weight, when unloaded, of three tons or more, when loaded, of 4,535.91 Kilograms or more, but does not include a passenger vehicle, an ambulance, a hearse, a casket wagon or any vehicle of a Police or Fire Department.
- (7) "Court" means a Provincial Offence Court or, where jurisdiction in respect of the offence is conferred upon a Provincial Court (Family Division) by any other Act, the Provincial Court (Family Division).
- (8) "Corner" means the point of intersection of curbs or edges of the travelled portion of the highway used for vehicular traffic.
- (9) "Crosswalk" shall have the same meaning as defined in the *Highway Traffic Act*, R.S.O. 1990 c.H.8 as am.
- (10) "Curb" includes the edge of the travelled portion of the roadway.
- (11) "Driveway" shall mean that part of the sidewalk or boulevard used as a vehicular access to a parking lot, or to private or public property.
- (12) "Emergency Vehicle" includes an ambulance, police vehicle and fire apparatus.

- (13) "Handicapped" and "Handicapped person" refers to a person who by reason of a physical infirmity, is unable to walk or advance on foot or transport without the aid or assistance of another person or without the use of a wheelchair.
- (14) "Highway" shall have the same meaning as defined in the *Highway Traffic Act*, R.S.O. 1990 c. H.8. as am.
- (15) "Holidays" includes days proclaimed as such by the Mayor or Council by By-law or resolution, Civic Holiday and Boxing Day.
- (16) "Intersection" means "the area embraced within the prolongation or connection of the lateral curb lines or, if none, then of the lateral boundary lines of two or more highways that join one another at an angle, whether or not one highway crosses the other.
- (17) "King's Highway" includes the secondary highways and tertiary roads designated under The Public Transportation and Highway Improvement Act, R.S.O 1990 c.PSO.
- (18) "Lot" means a parcel of land.
- (19) "Motor assisted bicycle" shall have the same meaning as defined in the *Highway Traffic Act*, R.S.O. 1990 c.h.8 as am.
- (20) "Motorcycle" shall have the same meaning as defined in the *Highway Traffic Act*, R.S.O. -1990 c.H.8 as am.
- (21) "Motor Vehicle" shall have the same meaning as defined in the *Highway Traffic Act*, R.S.O. c.H.8 as am.
- (22) "Municipal Law Enforcement Officer" means a person(s) appointed to enforce the provisions of this By-law and includes a Peace Officer employed with the Deseronto Police Service.
- (23) "One Way Street" means a street upon which vehicular traffic is limited to movement in one direction.
- (24) "Operator" means a person who operates a Motor Vehicle on a Highway.
- (25) "Park" or "Parking" shall have the same meaning as defined in the *Highway Traffic Act*, R.S.O. 1990 c.H.8 as am.
- (26) "Parking Infraction" means any unlawful parking, standing or stopping of a vehicle that constitutes an offence under this By-law.
- (27) "Parking Space" means a portion of a parking space zone designated as such by suitable markings on the surface of the street.
- (28) "Pedestrian" means a person afoot, in a wheelchair and a child in a baby carriage.
- (29) "Pedestrian Crosswalk" shall have the same meaning as defined in the *Highway Traffic Act*, R.S.O. 1990 c.H.8 as am.

- (30) "Private Roadway" shall mean any privately owned road, lane, ramp or other means of vehicular access to or egress from a building or structure and it may include a parking lot.
- (31) "Police Officer" means a member of a Police Service or a person authorized by the Chief Constable to regulate or direct traffic.
- (32) "Provincial. Offences Officer" means a Police Officer or a person designated under Section 1(2) of the *Provincial Offences Act*, R.S.O. 1990 c.P. 33, as amended from time to time.
- (33) "Roadway" shall have the same meaning as defined in the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990 c.H.8 as am.
- (34) "School Crossing Guard" means a person sixteen years of age or older, employed by the Town of Deseronto to direct the movement of children across a highway.
- (35) "Service Vehicle" includes a marked vehicle operated by members of the Public Works Department of the Corporation of the Town of Deseronto and a marked vehicle operated by members of the Ontario Clean Water Agency.
- (36) "Sidewalk" means that portion of a street between the curb lines or .the lateral; lines of a roadway and the adjacent property line intended for the use of pedestrians.
- (37) "Stand" or "Standing" means the halting of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except for the purpose of and while actually engaged in the receiving or discharging passengers or merchandise.
- (38) "Stop" or "Stopping" means the halting of a vehicle, even momentarily, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a Police Officer, a Provincial Offence Officer, Municipal By-law Enforcement Officer, or of a traffic control sign or signal.
- (39) "Through Highway" means a highway or part of a highway designated as such by the Minister of Transportation or by this By-law, and every such highway shall be marked by a stop sign or yield right-of-way sign in compliance with the regulations of the Ministry of Transportation.
- (40) "Traffic" shall include pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles and other conveyances either singly or together while using any highway for the purpose of travel.
- (41) "Traffic Control Signal" means any device, manually, electrically or mechanically operated for the regulation of traffic.
- (42) "Traffic Official" means an individual appointed by the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Deseronto who is authorized to place, erect or maintain Authorized Signs and Traffic Control Signals and includes a member of the Department of Public Works.
- (43) "Turning Basin" means a roadway that terminates in a circular manner.
- (44) "U-turn" means the turning of a vehicle within a roadway so as to proceed in the opposite direction.

- (45) "Vehicle" shall have the same meaning as defined in the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990 c.H.8 as am.
- (46) "Wheelchair" shall have the same meaning as defined in the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990 c.H.8. as am.

PART II - REGULATION OF TRAFFIC

Obedience to Police Officers

2. The lawful directions of a Police Officer, or Provincial Offences Officer or Municipal Law Enforcement Officer for the regulation of traffic shall be obeyed notwithstanding any provision of the By-law, where he/she considers it reasonably necessary,
- a) to ensure orderly movement of traffic;
 - b) to prevent injury or damage to persons or property; or
 - c) to permit proper action in an-emergency.

Traffic Signs and Signals

3. Traffic Officials appointed by the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Deseronto are authorized to place, erect and maintain such Authorized Signs and Traffic Control Signals as are required to give effect to the provisions of this By-law or as are required to warn or guide Traffic for the safety and convenience of the general public.
4. No person shall place, maintain, or display upon or in view of any road any sign, signal, marking or device, which purports to be or is an imitation of or resembles an Authorized Sign or Traffic Control Signal,; or which conceals from view or interferes -with the effectiveness of an Authorized Sign or Traffic Control Signal.
5. The erection of Traffic Control Signals and Stop Signs is hereby authorized at the Intersections or locations set out in Schedule A of this By-law.
6. The Highways set out in Column 1 of Schedule B to this By-law, between the limits set out in Column 2 of the said schedule are designated as Through Highways for the purpose of the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, cH-8 as am.

Miscellaneous Driving Rules

7. The driver or Operator of a Motor Vehicle emerging from a Driveway or building onto a highway shall bring the vehicle to a full stop immediately before driving onto the Boulevard and upon proceeding shall yield the right of way to Pedestrians upon the Boulevard.
8. No person shall make a U-Turn unless it can be made in safety and without interfering with other Traffic.
9. No person shall, except- under' the direction of a Police Officer, Provincial Offences Officer or Municipal Law Enforcement Officer drive a Vehicle on a road between the Motor Vehicles comprising a funeral procession while the Vehicles in such procession are in motion.

10. No person shall drive a Motor Vehicle upon a Sidewalk or footpath except for the purpose of directly crossing the Sidewalk or footpath.
11. No person shall drive a Motor Vehicle over a raised Curb except at a place where there is a ramp.
12. No person operating a Motorcycle on a Roadway shall carry more persons thereon than the Motorcycle is designed and properly equipped to carry.
13. No driver of a Motor Vehicle shall drive such Motor Vehicle on, over or across any fire hose laid on any street unless directed to do so by the person in charge of such a hose, or by a Police Officer, Provincial Offence Officer or Municipal Law Enforcement Officer.
14. The provisions of Sections 8,9,10,11 and 13 do not apply in the case of an ambulance., Police Officer or fire apparatus responding to an emergency.
15. The provisions of Sections 10 and 11 do not apply in the case ' of members of the Department of Public Works or Ontario Water Resources Agency acting in the course of their duties.

Pedestrians' Rights and Duties

16. No person shall:
 - a) play or take part in any game or sport upon a Roadway.
 - b) use roller skates, skateboards, coasters or toy vehicles upon a Roadway, Sidewalk or municipal parking facility in the Business Improvement Area,
17. Three or more persons shall not stand in a group or near to one another on any Roadway or Boulevard in such a manner as to obstruct the through passage of Vehicles or Pedestrians after a request to move has been made to them by a Police Officer, Provincial Offences Officer, Municipal Law Enforcement Officer or other person duly authorized thereto.
Bicycles
 18. (1) A person operating a Bicycle upon a Roadway shall ride as near the right hand side of the Roadway as practicable and shall exercise due care when passing a standing vehicle or one proceeding in the same direction.
 - (2) Persons operating Bicycles upon a Roadway shall ride in single file.
 - (3) No person operating a Bicycle shall carry any package, bundle or article which prevents the rider from keeping both hands on the handle bars.
 - (4) No person shall ride or permit any child in his/her custody or care to ride a Bicycle or tricycle with one or more wheels more than 50 centimetres in diameter upon a Sidewalk.
 - (5) No person shall ride or permit any child in his/her custody or care to ride a Bicycle or tricycle upon a Sidewalk or any Highway in such a manner as to interfere with the other persons using the same.

School Crossing Guard

19. (1) A School Crossing Guard about to direct children across a Highway with a speed limit not in excess of 50 kilometres per hour shall, prior to entering the Roadway, display a school crossing stop sign in an upright position so that it is visible to Traffic approaching from each direction.
- (2) Where a School crossing stop sign is displayed as provided in Subsection 1, the Operator of any Vehicle approaching the Stop sign shall Stop before reaching the crossing.
- (3) A School Crossing Guard shall not display on a Highway a school crossing stop sign under any circumstances other than those set out in Subsection 1.
- (4) No person other, than a School Crossing Guard shall display on a Highway a school crossing stop sign.
- (5) School crossing stop signs used by School Crossing Guards shall comply with the regulations to the Highway Traffic Act.

Sidewalks

20. Where sidewalks are not provided on a Highway, Pedestrians walking along the Highway shall walk on the left side thereof facing oncoming Traffic and, when walking along the Roadway, shall walk as close to the left edge thereof as possible.

PART III - STOPPING & PARKING REGULATIONS

Bicycles

21. No person shall park a Bicycle on a Roadway in such a manner as to obstruct Traffic.
General Stopping and Parking Regulations
22. (1) No person shall Park or Stop any Vehicle on any Roadway carrying two-way Traffic or any portion thereof except as follows:
 - (a) Where there is a raised Curb, on the right side on the travelled portion of the Roadway, having regard to the direction such Vehicle was proceeding, with its right front and rear wheels parallel to and not more than 15.0 centimetres out from such Curb;
 - (b) Where there is no Curb or a rolled Curb, with the right front and rear wheels parallel to and as near to the right-hand limit of the Roadway as is practicable without Stopping or Parking over a Sidewalk or footpath Or over any part of the Roadway where grass is grown or which is not intended for the use of Vehicles.
- (2) No person shall Park or Stop any Vehicle on any Roadway carrying one-way Traffic or any portion thereof except as follows:
 - (a) Where there is a raised Curb on either side of the travelled portion of the Roadway, with its outside front and rear wheels parallel to and no more than 15.0 centimetres out from such Curb;

- (b) Where there is no Curb or a rolled Curb, with its outside front and rear wheels parallel to and as near to the outside limit of the Roadway as is practicable without Stopping or Parking over a Sidewalk or footpath or over any part of the Roadway where grass is grown or which is not intended for the use of Vehicles;
- (c) Centennial Park Road south side, in a manner where Authorized Signs to that effect are displayed.

23. The provisions of Section 22 do not apply to Emergency Vehicles, hearses or Service Vehicles.

24. No person shall on any Highway Stand, Stop or Park any Vehicle.

- (1) on or over any Sidewalk, Boulevard, Crosswalk or footpath.
- (2) within an Intersection or Crosswalk.
- (3) alongside or across the Highway from any excavation or obstruction in the Roadway when free flow of Traffic would thereby be impeded.
- (4) on the Roadway side of any Stopped or Parked Vehicle.
- (5) upon any bridge or elevated structure except for the specific purpose of the disembarking or picking up of passengers or parcels.

25. No person shall on any Highway Park any Vehicle;

- (1) so as to obstruct Vehicles in the use of a Driveway or laneway, and in any event not closer than 1.5 metres to the edge of the Driveway or laneway.
- (2) within 3.0 metres of a point on the Curb or edge of the Roadway opposite any fire hydrant.
- (3) within 7.5 metres of an Intersection.
- (4) on any Roadway where the Roadway width is less than 6.0 metres.
- (5) between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. from December 1st to March 31st of the following year.
- (6) for the purpose of displaying the Vehicle for sale.
- (7) for the purpose of washing, greasing or repairing the Vehicle, except for such repairs as have been necessitated by an emergency.
- (8) in front of an entrance to or .exit from any building or enclosed space in which persons may be expected to congregate in large numbers, such as a hotel, theatre or auditorium.
- (9) in such a position as will prevent the removal of any other Vehicle previously parked.
- (10) so as to interfere with the formation of a funeral procession.

- (11) where Authorized Signs to the effect are displayed. (12) directly in front of a fire hall or police station.
26. NO person shall Park any Vehicle in a Parking Space designated "Police Only" at any time, unless it is a Police Vehicle.
27. No person shall Park any Vehicle in such a manner that it is not wholly within a Parking Space; however, if such Vehicle is of such length as to prevent it from being Parked within one Parking Space, then the person Parking the same may lawfully occupy one or more Parking Spaces as required.
28. No person shall park a Commercial Motor Vehicle outside of the Commercial Business District of the Town of Deseronto for a longer period of time than 90 minutes.
29. Where Authorized Signs to that effect are displayed, no person shall Park a Vehicle on any Highway in the Commercial Business District, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock a.m. and 6:00 o'clock p.m. for a period in excess of 2 hours at any time excepting that period between Saturday at 6:01 o'clock p.m. and Monday 7:59 o'clock a.m. inclusive.
30. No person shall Park a boat trailer or a camping trailer on the "Park Roadway" running parallel to Centennial Park.
31. No person shall Park a Vehicle within 7.5 metres of the lot on which a fire hall is located on that side of the street on which such fire hall is located or within 30 metres of such lot on the opposite side of said street unless the person is a volunteer firefighter.
32. The provisions of Section 31 do not apply to Emergency Vehicles, hearses, or Service Vehicles.

Stopping for Resale of Goods, Etc.

33. (1) No person who sells, offers for sale or takes orders for goods, wares, merchandise or produce from a Vehicle shall for the purpose of carrying on his/her business, Stop the Vehicle on any Roadway 'between two intersecting Roads for more than thirty minutes on any one day, or for more than ten minutes at any one location.
- (2) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to permit the Stopping or Parking of a Vehicle where Stopping or Parking is prohibited.

Loading Zone

34. No person shall Park any Vehicle on a Roadway at a place marked by an Authorized Sign as a passenger or freight loading zone during the time shown on such sign, unless the person is Parked there for the purpose of loading or discharging passengers or freight.

School Zone

35. Where Authorized Signs to that- effect are displayed, no person shall Park any Vehicle on either side of the portion of Roadway adjacent to a school or playground.

Handicapped Parking Zones

36. No person shall Park or Stop a Motor Vehicle or leave a Motor Vehicle Standing, in any parking space marked for use by the Handicapped by an Authorized Sign, unless;
- (a) That person, or a passenger in the Vehicle or to be picked up as a passenger, is Handicapped, and;
 - (b) The Vehicle bears a "Handicapped" designation. "No Parking" and "No Stopping" Signs
37. "No Parking" or "No Stopping" signs may be erected by a Police Officer in the event of emergency, approved parades, special events or funerals on any Highway or portion thereof during such time or times as may be deemed necessary for the proper and orderly control and regulation of Traffic for the safety of Pedestrians. No person shall Park or Stop, as the case may be, where prohibited by Authorized Signs erected pursuant to this section.

Parking of Motor Vehicles on Private Property

38. (1) No person shall Park or leave a Motor Vehicle on private property without authority from the owner or occupant of such property, and then only within the areas and to the extent authorized.
- (2) The Operator or owner of the Motor Vehicle Parked or left on private property shall not be liable to a penalty or to have the Motor Vehicle removed from such property, or impounded, under this section, except upon the complaint of the occupant or an adult resident of the property, delivered to the Deseronto Police Service.
39. Members, of the public shall be-informed of the parking restrictions contained in Section 25(5) of this By-law, be advertising at least twice in newspapers of general circulation in the Town of Deseronto in the month of November of each year.
Public Works, Etc.
40. No person shall Park a Vehicle in such a manner as to interfere with necessary civic services such as road repairing, snow ploughing or snow removal that already is in progress, nor Park a Vehicle at any place where Authorized Signs have been placed indicating any snow removal or other civic operations are to be commenced.

Restricted Parking on Municipal Property

41. Where Authorized Signs to that effect are displayed, no person shall Park or leave a Motor Vehicle on municipal property.

PART IV - ENFORCEMENT, OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

42. It shall be the duty of the Police Officers, Provincial Offences Officers, Municipal Law Enforcement Officers and/or those persons lawfully assigned to the enforcement of this By-law for the Town of Deseronto, to attach to any Vehicle found in violation of PART III of this By-law a Parking Infraction Notice informing the owner or Operator thereof of the violation and providing for the payment of the fines within 10 days.
43. Failure of the Police Officer, Provincial Offences Officer, Municipal Law Enforcement Officer and/or those persons lawfully assigned to the enforcement of this By-law for the Town of

Deseronto to comply with Section 50 is not a defence to the prosecution for a violation of PART III of this Bylaw.

44. Each such owner or Operator may, within 10 days of the time when such Parking Infraction Notice is attached to such Vehicle, pay to the Clerk of the Town of Deseronto, or other designated official on duty at the Town Hall who is authorized to accept such thereon as a voluntary payment for and in full, satisfaction for such violation and such payment is a defence to any prosecution for such violation.
45. Any person who violates any provision of PART II of this Bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and upon conviction shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$25.00 and not more than \$200.00.
46. Any person who violates any provision of PART III of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and upon conviction shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$15.00 and not more than \$100.00.
47. Each hour that a Vehicle continues in violation of any of the provisions of PART III of this By-law shall be deemed to constitute a new offence.
48. The Operator of a Vehicle not being the owner is liable to any penalty provided under this By-law and the owner of the Vehicle is also liable to such penalty unless the owner establishes that at the time of the offence committed the Vehicle was in the possession of a person other than the owner or his/her chauffeur without the owner's consent.
49. The provisions of this By-law shall not be interpreted so as to be inconsistent with the Highway Traffic Act.
50. Where a Certificate of Offence or Certificate of Parking Infraction issued under authority of the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990 c.P 33, as amended or an offence against this By-law, the words or expressions set out in Column 1 of Schedule C may be used on a certificate to designate the offence under the section of this By-law set out opposite thereto in column 2.
51. A Police Officer, Provincial Offences Officer, Municipal Law Enforcement Officer and/or those persons lawfully assigned to the enforcement of this By-law for the Town of Deseronto and for the carrying out of the provisions of this By-law, may take into his/her custody any Motor Vehicle found Parked or Stopped in violation of this By-law or of the Highway Traffic Act and may cause same to be taken to and stored in a suitable place and all costs and charges for removal, care or storage, are a lien upon the Motor Vehicle which may be enforced in the manner provided by Section 42 of the Repair and Storage Liens Act R.S.O. 1990 c.R. 25.
52. Proceedings in respect of offences under Part II of this By-Law may be commenced and carried on under the provisions of Part 11 of the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990 c.P. 33.
53. Proceedings in respect of offences under Part III of this By-law may be commenced and carried on under the provisions of Part II of the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990 c.P. 33.
54. PART II of the Provincial Offences Act R.S.O. 1990, c.P 33, as amended applies in respect of all Parking, Stopping or Standing infractions under this By-law and amendments thereto.
55. By-law 3-76 and amendments thereto are hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE A

TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNALS AND STOP SIGNS

1. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northwest corner of BRANT STREET, GREEN STREET, MILL STREET, ST. GEORGE STREET, CENTRE STREET and the southeast corner of PEARL STREET, COLLEGE STREET, BRANT STREET, GREEN STREET, MILL STREET, ST. GEORGE STREET, CENTRE STREET, FOURTH STREET, SECOND STREET and FIRST STREET with DUNDAS STREET.
2. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northeast corner of COLLEGE STREET, BRANT STREET, GREEN STREET, MILL STREET, ST. GEORGE STREET and FOURTH STREET and the southwest corner of COLLEGE STREET, BRANT STREET, GREEN STREET, MILL STREET, ST. GEORGE STREET, FOURTH STREET and FIRST STREET with THOMAS STREET.
3. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northwest, the northeast and southeast corner of the intersection of PEARL STREET with THOMAS STREET, making it a THREE-WAY STOP.
4. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northwest, northeast, southwest and southeast corners of the intersection of CENTRE STREET with THOMAS STREET, making it an ALL-WAY STOP.
5. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northwest and southeast corner of PRINCE STREET and SECOND STREET with THOMAS STREET.
6. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northwest corner of MECHANIC STREET, PEARL STREET, COLLEGE STREET, BRANT STREET, GREEN STREET, MILL STREET, ST. GEORGE STREET, CENTRE STREET, PRINCE STREET, FOURTH STREET, SECOND STREET and FIRST STREET, the southeast corner of MILL STREET, FIFTH STREET, FOURTH STREET and FIRST STREET with MAIN STREET.
7. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northwest, northeast and southwest corner of the intersection of Water Street with FOURTH STREET, making it a THREE-WAY STOP.
8. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northeast corner of Water Street with MILL STREET.
9. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northeast, southwest and southeast corner of the intersection of MECHANIC STREET with PARK STREET, making it a THREWAY STOP.
10. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northeast corner of PEARL STREET and the southwest corner of PEARL STREET and COLLEGE STREET with PARK STREET.
11. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northeast corner of MILL STREET, ST. GEORGE STREET and the southwest corner of ST. GEORGE STREET and CENTRE STREET with EDMON STREET.

12. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northeast corner of BRANT STREET, the northwest corner of GREEN STREET, the southeast corner of GREEN STREET and the southwest corner of MILL STREET with CROSS STREET.
13. That a STOP SIGN be erected at the southeast corner of BRANT STREET and GREEN STREET with NORTH STREET.
14. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northeast corner of MILL STREET, northwest corner of FINGLAND'S LANE, the southeast corner of ST. GEORGE and CENTRE STREETS with MAPLE AVENUE.
15. That a STOP SIGN be erected at the northeast corner of CENTRE STREET with STANLEY AVENUE.
16. That STOP SIGNS be erected at the northwest corner of FIFTH STREET and the northwest corner of the exit from the Municipal Parking Lot with WATER STREET.
